REQUIREMENTS AND SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

General requirements

- Registered undergraduate students (3rd or 4th year) and graduate students from all Reichman University schools.
- Excellent research skills.
- Deep knowledge and understanding of current affairs, global trends, and international diplomacy.
- High-level English fluency.
- Commitment to 8-10 hours weekly; available for work during both fall and spring semesters.
- Mandatory and active participation in all program meetings and workshops during the year.

Accreditation:

If they have not previously completed an accredited internship, students can choose to intern for **2 academic credits**, subject to approval by their academic track coordinators. They may also opt to participate in the program as a non-credit internship.

Suitable candidates will be invited to an interview with our staff shortly after the submission deadline



Candidates may also be asked to complete a task relevant to their desired position
